

Year 3 Parent Summary Summer Term We hope you all enjoyed the Easter holidays and are rested and ready for work this summer term. As you will see we have another exciting term lined up for the children!

<u>English</u>

This term the children will be using texts and videos based on Ancient Egypt to stimulate their creative writing. Please see link for example: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2XxhNMbpE2A</u>. The children will continue to develop their use of vocabulary and complex sentence structures through narrative. We will continue to work on grammatical skills and Year 3 spelling patterns. There will be a continued emphasis on cursive handwriting.



Reading lessons will focus on inference skills, summarising a text, and understanding the meaning behind unfamiliar vocabulary across a range of text types.

Mathematics

There will be a continued focus on learning all times tables to 12 and applying this knowledge to written multiplication and division strategies. The children will start by exploring money and then will then learn about equivalent fractions, in addition to adding and subtracting fractions. The children will also explore 2D and 3D shapes properties and different types of angles. Throughout the term, there will be an emphasis on problem solving questions, with a focus on multi-step word problems.

Science

In Science, the children will explore and learn about plants; labelling and understanding the functions of different parts of the plant and how pollination works. They will explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) through practical investigations. In addition to this, the children will also explore different light sources, opaque and transparent materials and investigation how shadows change throughout the day.



Computing

In Computing the children will learn about programming. They will continue to learn coding using a combination of different formats. Children will also continue to work on Google Suite using the Chrome Books, create quizzes and present their work in variety of ways.

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<u>Cookery</u>

During the term the children will have cooking opportunities covering the 6 strands of cooking skills; weighing and measuring, cutting and knife skills, mixing, shaping and assembling, heating, serving and assembling.

Humanities

Our topic this term is Egypt. The children will learn about the history of Ancient Egypt, as well as the significance of the river Nile and consider the age old problem, how were the pyramids made? Later in the term they will compare weather patterns in different parts of the world.



<u>Music</u>

Recorder lessons will continue to take place each week, developing the children's ability to read musical notation and work on singing in harmony with each other. A focus will be on finger dexterity and tone production. They will be practising for the Recorder Rebels concert at the Union Chapel (more details to follow).

Physical Education

Swimming lessons will continue to take place every Tuesday. The children will also take part in athletics and invasion games learning how to be a good sportsman.



<u>PSHE</u>

In PSHE the children will be developing their understanding of emotional and mental Well- being. They will think about their careers, economic wellbeing and physical health and wellbeing.



Art and Design

In art the children will be creating Egyptian art work. They will begin by sketching the outline of an Egyptian Mummy. They will then bring their sketch to life using either water colours or mosaic, focusing on a pattern that uses complementary colours.

Design Technology

The children will make a Scarab Beetle out of clay, following through the design process from an initial idea to the final piece.
