Year 1 Daily & Weekly Routines

- 8:40 Soft Start, 8:55 register
- Prompt arrival important to ensure morning work is not missed and pupils settle for their day of learning.
- Library session each week on a Wednesday.
- School home reading book will be changed weekly on the day of our library.
- Pupils' reading books must be in school EVERYDAY.
- Word of the Day (For example, 'glad').
- Our P.E. days are Monday and Friday afternoons.
- Children wear their P.E. kit on Monday but carry it in on Fridays.

Year 1 Phonics & Reading

- Daily Phonics Lessons
- Before School Intervention Phonics Sessions
- Daily Reading Group and Individual Sessions where appropriate
- 1- 2 reading books weekly at appropriate phonics level plus 1 library book
- Library Time weekly
- Daily Class Storybook

Homework

- Set on Wednesday on Tapestry.
- Reading every night at home. Parents or Carers to record reading and sign daily their child's purple reading log. Records will be monitored weekly by the teachers and teaching assistants.
- Teachers will keep records in school of all reading / phonic sessions and comment in the purple reading records when appropriate.
- We are introducing Reading and Maths Homework Books later in the term. Completed activities in these books to be brought back on Wednesdays.
- Topic or science project work on the current topic each half term.

- Supporting homework.
- •Good communication between the school and home.
- Getting a good sleep on a school night!

How can I help with Reading?


- Have an involvement with your child's reading. Read with your child - promoting the love of reading at home and in school.


