- When your child is fully settled they will have access to our Extended School service, *if applied for.*




Important things to know:

Phonics and Reading


- All children have two wordless books to read at home
- Once we have completed the first two phonics sets, children will begin to take home books with simple words
- Your child will only take the books home when they are fluent at school!



Phonics and Reading

Speaking and listening are the key skills children need to develop their ability to read and write.








What can you do?

- Talk to them!
- Model and expect good listening.
- Encourage the understanding and use of new vocabulary.
- Sing songs, rhymes and read poems, enjoying the rhyme and rhythm of words.
- Read to your child regularly and develop their story language





Phonics Teaching

- Six phases
- Phase 1 mostly taught in Nursery
- Phase 2 and 3/4 taught in Reception
- Past pace, lots of consolidation
- Phase 4/5 Year 1
- Year 1 phonics screening
- **Phase 6** Year 2

Phonics Vocabulary

- Phonics the learning of letters and sounds
- Phoneme the sound a letter makes
- Grapheme the written letter
- Segmenting breaking a word up into its component sounds
- Blending hearing sounds together to make a word

Phonics Vocabulary

- Tricky words words that cannot be decoded using phonics
- vc and cvc c = consonant v = vowel
- Digraph a sound made with two letters eg. sh ai oi
- Phonetically plausible written phonetically that it can still be read although it is spelt incorrectly eg. torl werk cabij

Phase 1

- •All about sounds musical, environmental, voice etc
- Aural discrimination of sounds, including letter sounds
- Blending and segmenting orally


Phase 2

- Learning specific letters and sounds
- Schwa! (Yucky sounds)
- Letter names

- Tricky Words
- Pronunciation Jolly Phonics Letter Sounds (British English)



Blending

- For reading
- Oral blending
- Sound buttons
- Letter sounds, not names



Segmenting

- For writing
- Phonics fingers



Phase 3 sounds

- Sounds
- More tricky words for reading
- Digraphs (ai, ee, ie...)
- Blending, segmenting, reading
- Writing words, captions and sentences






