## Yr 6 Daily & Weekly Routines

- Pupils' reading books must be in school EVERY DAY.
- Word of the Week.

## **Homework**

- Set on Friday on Google Classroom.
- Weekly spellings to be tested on the Friday of the following week.
- Reading every night at home for at least 20 minutes. Children should record their reading in their purple Reading log and parents should sign the log. Pupils should find a new word or make a comment to show that they have read thoroughly. Teachers will monitor these records, and teacher records will be kept in school.
- We are introducing SATs homework books. Completed activities in these books to be brought back on Fridays. Pages for homework will also be listed on Google Classroom.
- Topic or science project work on the current topic each half term.

## **SATs**

- SATs will be taking place this year
- Starting 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024
- Maths; reading comprehension; spelling, punctuation & grammar
- Writing: continuous assessment
- Their will be booster sessions and support sessions scheduled throughout the year. The expectation of the offered booster sessions are that the pupils attend.

## How can I help with Reading?


- Have an involvement with your child's reading. Read with your child promoting the love of reading at home and in school.

### A full Curriculum
