Year 1 Daily & Weekly Routines


- 8:35 Soft Start, 8:50 register
- Prompt arrival important to ensure morning work is not missed and pupils settle for their day of learning.
- Phonics takes place from 9-9.30am Tuesday Friday (and Monday afternoons).
- Library session each week on a Tuesday.
- School home reading book will be changed weekly on a Friday
- Pupils' reading books must be in school EVERYDAY
- Word of the Week
- Our P.E. days are **Monday** and **Fridays**.

Homework

- Set on Fridays on Google Classroom.
- Phonics Home Learning sheets.
- Reading every night at home for at least 20 minutes. Parents should record and sign their child's reading in their purple Teachers will monitor these records, and teacher records will be kept in school.
- We are introducing Comprehension, SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Maths Homework Books. Completed activities in these books to be brought back on the following **Friday**.
- Topic/Science and RE project work on the current topic completed for each half term.

How can parents help?

- The best help is interest taken in learning and progress.

- •Good communication between the school and home.

How can I help with Reading?

- Have an involvement with your child's reading. Read with your child - promoting the love of reading at home and in school.
- Practise Phonics Home Learning
- Children should be reading a range of genres fiction/non-fiction/ poetry/magazines.
- Talking about stories and have discussions about what you have read.

Phonics

- Phonics plays a vital part of the Year 1 Curriculum.
- The phonics Screening Test is a statutory assessment that takes place in June. It tests children's decoding skills.
- In Year 1 we use the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds scheme which builds upon your child's Phonics learning from Reception.
- Phonics workshops will take place in October.

How can I help with Maths?

- Counting from any number forwards and backwards to 100.
- Counting in 2s, 5s, 10s.
- Practising number bonds to 10 and 20.
- Timetables Rockstars Numbots (log ins to be handed out)
