

Year 2 Expectations

- As a Catholic school we strive to uphold our Catholic ethos.

- Fostering greater independence in their learning
- Children taking responsibility for their learning (homework) and behaviour
- Children taking pride in the appearance and presentation of their work
- Keeping the classroom tidy and respecting resources
- Rules and values agreed to ensure clear expectations
- Dojo point awards
- Traffic light system amber to gold

Yr 2 Daily & Weekly Routines

- 8:35 Soft Start, 8:50 registration
- Prompt arrival important to ensure morning work is not missed and pupils settle for their day of learning.
- Library session each week on a Friday
- School home reading book will be changed weekly on Wednesdays.
- Pupils' reading books must be in school EVERY DAY.
- Word of the Week.
- Our P.E. days are Thursdays and Fridays.

Phonics is still important!

- Year 2 continue to follow the Little Wandle phonics programme
- Daily phonics and guided reading sessions
- Targeted support for children to increase their reading fluency
- Booster sessions in place after school on Mondays to Thursdays, that we strongly advise children attend if they are invited
- Phonics booster groups will be starting Week 4 (22nd September)

Homework

- Reading every night at home for at least 20 minutes. All reading should be recorded in their purple Reading log and parents must sign the log. Teachers will monitor these records, and teacher records will be kept in school.
- Set on Friday on Google Classroom.
- Children will receive English and Maths homework. Completed activities are to be brought back to school on **Thursdays**. Pages for homework can be found on Google Classroom.
- As a Catholic school we also give RE homework, which will be sent out every 2 weeks. This will also be on Google Classroom.
- Topic or Science project work on the current topic each half term.

KS1 SATS

- No longer statutory requirement
- St Joseph's choose to use these materials to help measure a pupils progress
- Part of wider assessment toolkit that aid teachers in assessing the children's learning

How can parents help?

- •The best help is interest taken in learning and progress.
- •Record the wonderful learning that takes place at home on Google classroom.
- •Supporting homework.
- •Good communication between the school and home.
- Getting a good sleep on a school night!
- •Arriving to school on-time and being in class at 8.50, the latest.



How can I help with Reading?

- Have an involvement with your child's reading. Read with your child - promoting the love of reading at home and in school.
- Children should be reading a range of genres – fiction/nonfiction/ poetry/magazines.
- All children are encouraged to read the 50 recommended Year 2 books, many of which can be found in our library.



How can I help with Maths?

- 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- Number bonds to 20
- Place value to ones, tens and hundreds.
- Knowing numbers in numerals and writing
- Telling time to o'clock, quarter past, quarter to and half past
- Find opportunities to explore maths in your everyday lives.
