Year 1 Daily & Weekly Routines

- ▶ 8:35 Soft Start, 8:50 register
- It is important students arrive on time for Soft Start and Register to ensure a smooth transition into the daily schedule/ routine
- Prompt arrival important to ensure morning work is not missed and pupils settle for their day of learning.
- Library session each week. If books aren't returned it is a £5 charge.
- School Phonics book will be changed weekly on a Friday.
- Pupils' reading books must be in school **EVERY DAY**.
- Word of the Week.
- Our P.E. days are Mondays and Fridays.

Homework

- Set on Fridays on Google Classroom.
- Phonics Home Learning sheets.
- Reading every night at home for at least 20 minutes. Parents should record and sign their child's reading in their purple Teachers will monitor these records, and teacher records will be kept in school.
- We are introducing Comprehension, SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Maths Homework Books. Completed activities in these books to be brought back on the following Friday.
- Topic/Science and RE project work on the current topic completed for each half term.

How parents can help?

- > The best help is interest taken in learning and progress.
- > Record the wonderful learning that takes place at home on Google classroom.
- > Supporting homework.
- > Good communication between the school and home.
- Getting a good sleep on a school night!
- > Arriving to school **on-time** and being in class at 8.30am with 8:50 being the latest.



How can I help with Reading?

- ► Have an involvement with your child's reading. Read with your child everyday. Promoting the love of reading at home and in school.
- Children should be exposed to a range of genres fiction/non-fiction/ poetry/magazines.
- All children are encouraged to practise phase 2,3 & 5 sounds and phonics daily/ weekly.

Phonics

- Phonics plays a vital part of the Year 1 Curriculum.
- The phonics Screening Test is a statutory assessment that takes place in June. It tests children's decoding skills.
- In Year 1 we use the Little Wandle Letters and Sounds scheme which builds upon your child's Phonics learning from Reception.
- Phonics workshops will take place on the 9th of October.



How can I help with Maths?

- Number bonds to 1 and 200.
- Place value with tens and ones
- Counting from any number forwards and backwards to 100.
- Counting in 2s, 5s, 10s.
- Timetables Rockstars Numbots (log ins to be handed out)
